## Participants wanted for discussion on HIV self-testing for gay and bisexual men

HIV self-testing would allow you to test yourself for HIV at home.

Currently, this kind of testing has not yet been approved for use in Canada. However, a group of researchers and community partners is developing a project to evaluate how HIV self-testing might be introduced.

To guide this project, we want to hear what gay and bisexual men think about HIV self-testing and the different ways it could be made available.
