# Women Under Surveillance: Mapping Criminalization's Creep into the Health and Social Care of Women Living with HIV

#### JOB DESCRIPTION

JOB TITLE: Peer Research Associate (PRA)

(\*\*4 Positions Available across Canada: **1 in British Columbia**, 1 in Saskatchewan and 2 in Ontario, one in Toronto and one in Thunder Bay)

**JOB DEFINITION:** PRAs are women living with HIV who are hired and trained as researchers, who have experiences and identities in common with the study participants who will be recruited as part of the research project.

JOB TYPE: Part-time from September 2015 to March 2018

#### **STUDY SUMMARY:**

Using a qualitative, arts-based approach that is grounded in community-based research principles, the Women Under Surveillance project aims to learn about how the criminalization of HIV non-disclosure and the assumptions underlying it affect the lives of women living with HIV across Canada, including their interactions with health and social service providers and other significant relationships. We will learn about the level of knowledge and understanding women living with HIV have of the current criminal law obligations to disclose HIV-positive status in Canada, as well as how women's perceptions of the consequences of HIV non-disclosure impact their lives through Body Mapping Workshops across Canada.

#### JOB SUMMARY:

PRAs will be hired in each of the study provinces (British Columbia, Saskatchewan and Ontario) to work a certain number of days each year of the project (approximately 20 days per year for 3 years) based on the number of training, planning, recruitment, Body Mapping Workshop and follow-up analysis days. All PRAs will complete a multi-phase orientation to the project and will primarily be responsible for planning and organizing the Body Mapping Workshop(s) in their province. PRAs will also support and offer a community perspective on recruitment, implementation, data analysis, and knowledge translation activities following the Body Mapping Workshops, in addition to participating in research team meetings throughout the duration of the project.

Women living with HIV from traditionally marginalized or silenced communities are strongly encouraged to apply, including racialized and Indigenous women; lesbian, bi, and transgendered women; women engaged in sex work; and other women from groups who have been historically under-represented in health research.

Women living with HIV with an academic or personal interest in issues related to the criminalization of HIV non-disclosure are also encouraged to apply.

#### **DESCRIPTION OF DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:**

- 1. Attend training webinars in Fall 2015 (dates to be determined).
- 2. Attend a 4-day, in-person PRA training session from February 16-19, 2016 in Toronto, Ontario.
- 3. Assist with and offer a community perspective on local planning, recruitment, implementation, facilitation and knowledge translation activities related to Body Mapping Workshop(s) in their province.
- 4. Participate in PRA team meetings via teleconference to discuss project issues and to support fellow PRAs (monthly to bi-monthly).
- 5. Participate in Research Team meetings as required.
- 6. Function as a community liaison to ensure that community concerns and priorities are considered within the study protocol and that study findings are communicated back to community stakeholders.

#### QUALIFICATIONS:

- A woman living with HIV who shares common identities with women recruited for the Body Mapping Workshops
- Past experience and/or interest in research
- Past experience and/or interest in working with women living with HIV
- Compassion and understanding towards issues related to diversity, inequality, stigma and the needs of women living with HIV
- Compassion and understanding towards issues related to the criminalization of HIV non-disclosure.
- Self-directed with an ability to work in a collaborative, diverse team environment
- Effective oral and written communication skills
- Strong presentation and facilitation skills
- Excellent time management and organizational skills
- Basic computer skills (e.g. comfortable using a computer, typing, sending emails, accessing the internet)
- Experience or interest in arts-based research methods
- Flexibility in working hours
- Experience working with confidential information

#### COMPENSATION:

PRAs will be compensated as follows for participating in this exciting research opportunity:

- Hourly compensation will be provided at a rate of \$25 per hour for approximately 20 days of work per year for 3 years based on time required for project orientation and training, Body Mapping Workshop development and implementation, data analysis involvement and ongoing knowledge translation activities.
- PRAs will be compensated for attending the Body Mapping training session.

- Travel, accommodation, food and incidentals will be provided for all in-person training and team meetings.
