Indicator 35: Number of referrals to ancillary support services for HCV-positive people, provided by CBOs	
Description	Total number of referrals made to support services for HCV-positive people by CBOs.
Significance	 Appropriate health information and social supports can play a key role in the self-management of health for people living with HCV (Temple-Smith, et al., 2004).
Data source	CBO administrative data
Possible disaggregation	Types of ancillary services provided (e.g. housing support, mental health and substance use services, food security services, etc.)
Limitations	 CBO tracking issues Lack of standardized approach for tracking referrals results in limited ability to compare numbers between organizations
