



HIV and HCV Primary Prevention Indicators

Indicator 6: Percent of respondents who report using a condom the last time they had sex	
Description	The percent of respondents who say they used a condom the last time they had sex with a non-marital, non-cohabiting partner, of those who have had sex with such a partner in the last 12 months. Reported condom use at last sex is a valid proxy for condom use behaviours over longer time periods (Younge et al., 2008).
Significance	Condom use is a key prevention strategy for HIV and HCV transmission.
Data source	Self-report client survey
Possible disaggregation	Target group
Limitations	Social desirability bias
