



## HIV and HCV Primary Prevention Indicators

Indicator 6: Percent of respondents who report using a condom the last time they had sex	
Description	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The percent of respondents who say they used a condom the last time they had sex with a non-marital, non-cohabiting partner, of those who have had sex with such a partner in the last 12 months. Reported condom use at last sex is a valid proxy for condom use behaviours over longer time periods (Younge et al., 2008).</li> </ul>
Significance	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Condom use is a key prevention strategy for HIV and HCV transmission.</li> </ul>
Data source	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Self-report client survey</li> </ul>
Possible disaggregation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Target group</li> </ul>
Limitations	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Social desirability bias</li> </ul>
