We are looking for people to take part in this 3-YEAR study to better understand how legalization is impacting people living with HIV who use cannabis to manage their symptoms.

PARTICIPANTS MUST:

- ✓ Identify as a person living with HIV
- ✓ Be 19 years of age or older
- ✓ Use cannabis to manage symptoms like appetite loss, weight loss (wasting), nausea, vomiting, pain, anxiety, depression, stress, and insomnia
- ✓ Live in British Columbia

You will be asked to take part in one interview every year for a total of 3 YEARS.

Each interview will be up to 90 minutes. You will receive a small payment for each interview.
