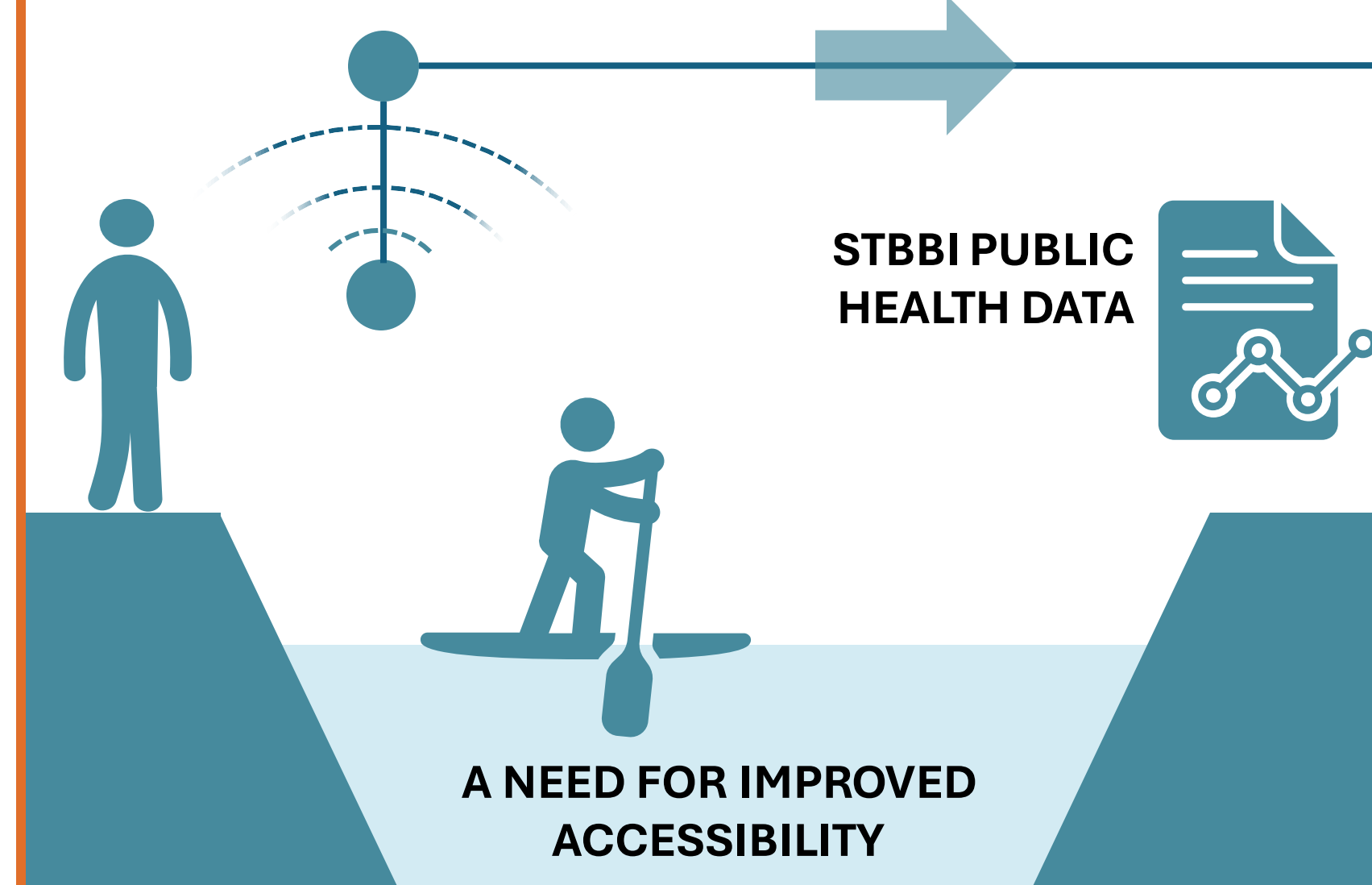
PURPOSE

BC COMMUNITIES

The importance of public health surveillance data in reducing the health impacts of HIV, viral hepatitis, and other Sexually Transmitted and Blood-Borne Infections (STBBIs) is well established.

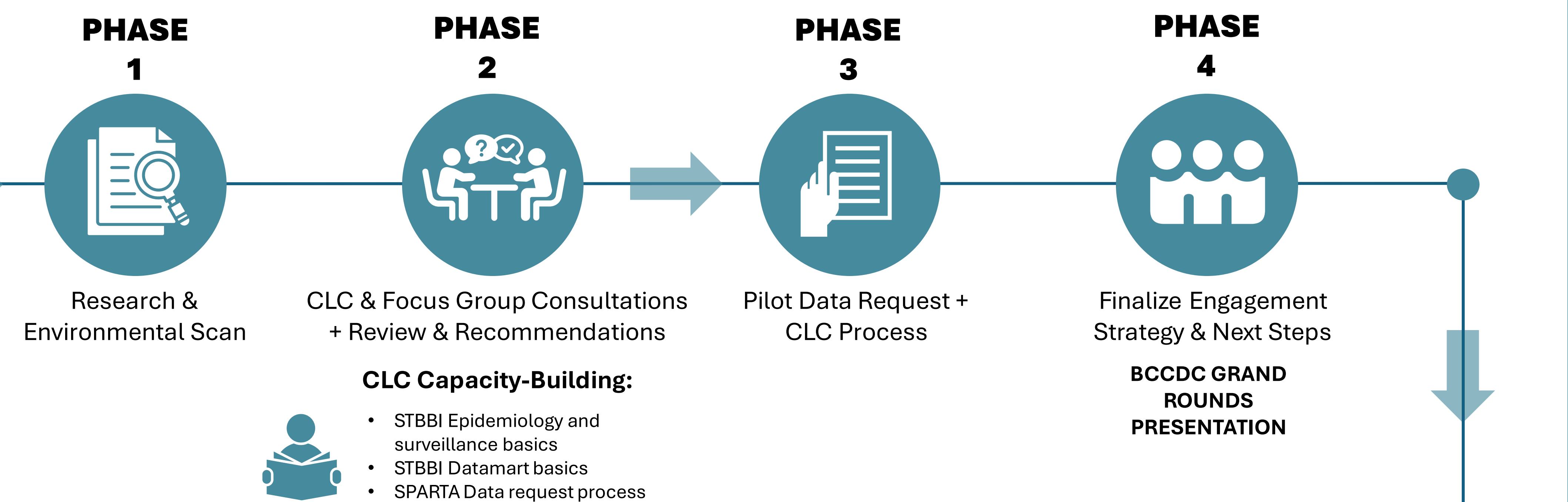
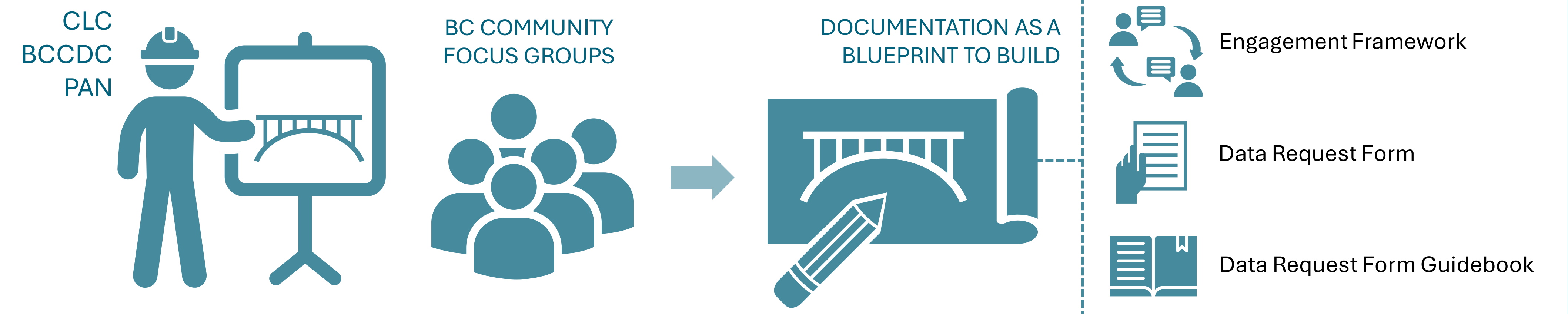
However, the accessibility and utilization of this information is limited for community, including people with lived and living experiences of STBBIs and Community-Based Organizations, despite their key role in providing STBBI prevention, testing and treatment services.

Additionally, communities are infrequently involved by public health in interpreting or disseminating this data.

GUIDING PRINCIPLES

1. DATA ABOUT US, SHOULD INVOLVE US.
2. DATA SHOULD BE ACCESSIBLE YET MANAGED WITH GOOD GOVERNANCE AND STEWARDSHIP.
3. LEARNING IS EVERYONE'S RESPONSIBILITY TO FOSTER A CULTURE OF SHARED KNOWLEDGE AND UNDERSTANDING.
4. ACTION FOR CHANGE REQUIRES COLLABORATION BETWEEN PUBLIC HEALTH AGENCIES AND LOCAL COMMUNITIES.

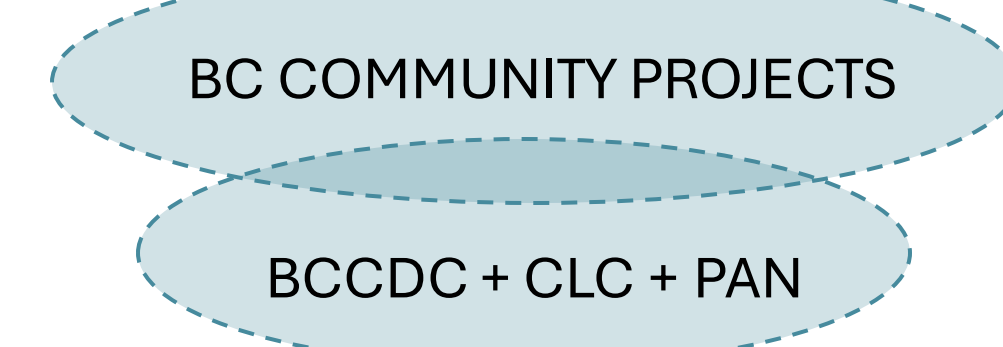

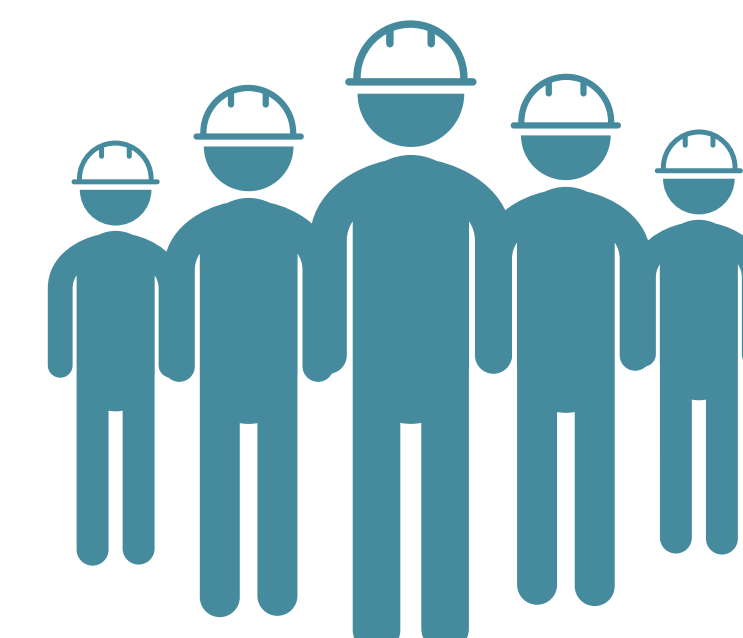
Reciprocal communication generated input from the CLC that has positively affected how the BCCDC and BC Health Authorities will conduct public health surveillance with communities.

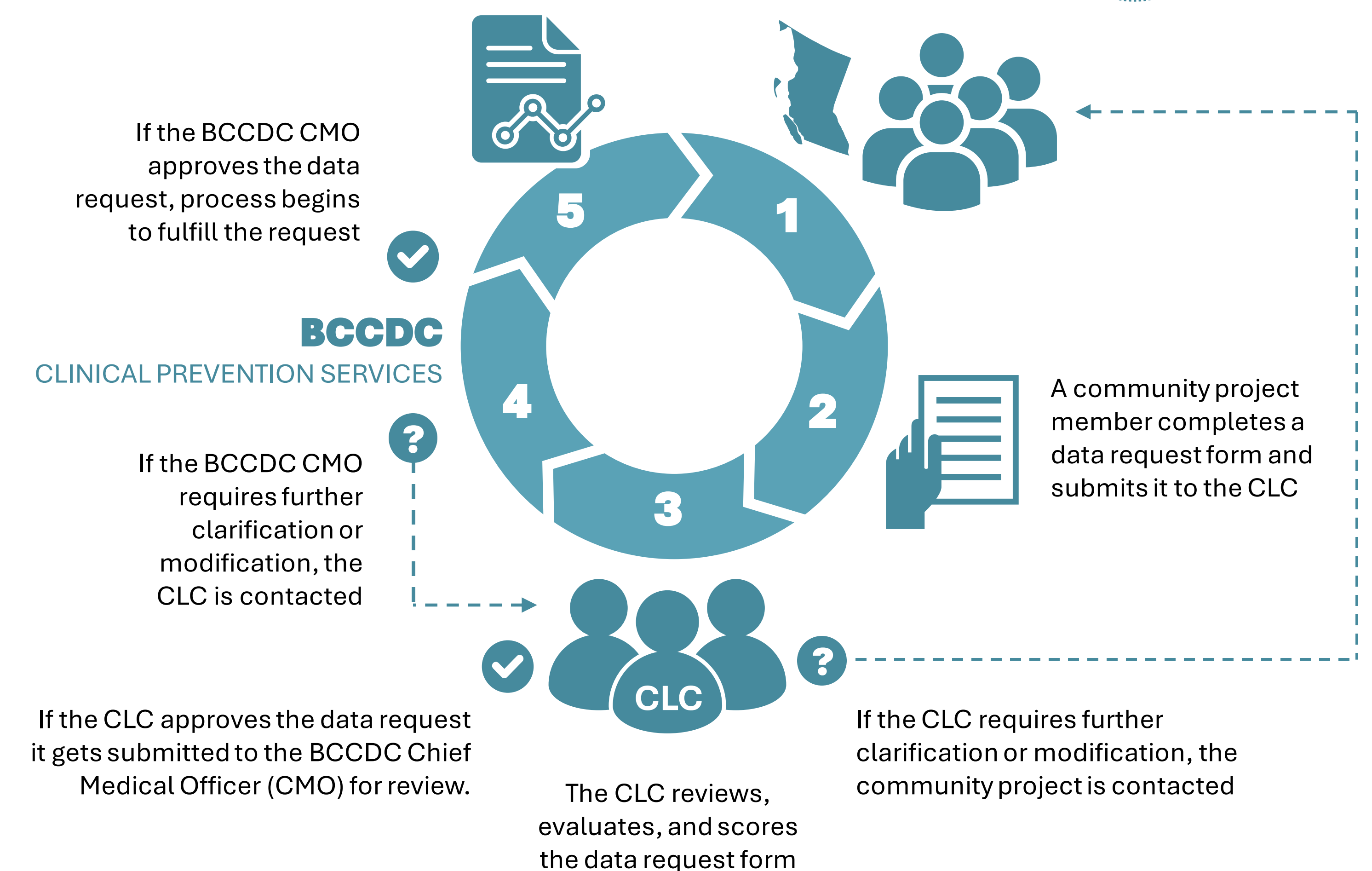
