

Over the past five years, British Columbia has seen major shifts in how sexually transmitted and blood-borne infections (STBBIs) - including HIV, hepatitis C, and syphilis - are affecting communities, from encouraging declines to persistent inequities.

In this keynote, Dr. Sofia Bartlett will take a 40-foot view of these trends, explore how evolving data standards are set to improve our understanding of STBBI epidemiology, and share what the next five years could hold. Grounded in hope, partnership, and collaboration, the talk will spotlight the vital role of community in turning data into action and seizing new opportunities to advance equity and impact.
