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ABC CONCEPTS

- **MARGINALIZATION:** Preventing individuals from participating fully in community life, civic organizations, or leisure activities, often living isolated or segregated communities
- **VISIBILITAZION:** to giving a voice and platform to marginalized individuals who are often denied public recognition. This process involves fighting systemic erasure by telling their stories and validating their
- **EMPOWERMENT:** The process to gaining the autonomy, confidence, and resources needed to control one's own life, make informed decisions, and claim personal rights. Represents a shift from powerlessness to self-determination.

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The Mothers of the Movement

- Marsha P. Johnson was an activist, self-identified drag queen, performer, and survivor.
- She was a prominent figure in the Stonewall uprising of 1969.
- Marsha went by "Black Marsha" before settling on Marsha P. Johnson.
- The "P" stood for "pay it no mind" which is what Marsha would say in response to questions about her gender.
- Trans women with HIV+

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Silvia Rae Rivera

- She was a transgender rights activist and well-known community worker in New York.
- She self-identified as a drag queen for most of her life, and later as a transgender person.
- She participated in demonstrations with the Gay Liberation Front.
- She co-founded STAR (Street Transvestite Action Revolutionaries) a group dedicated to helping homeless young drag queens, gay youth and trans women.

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HIGHLIGHTS OF THE HISTORY and ECONOMIC SYSTEM

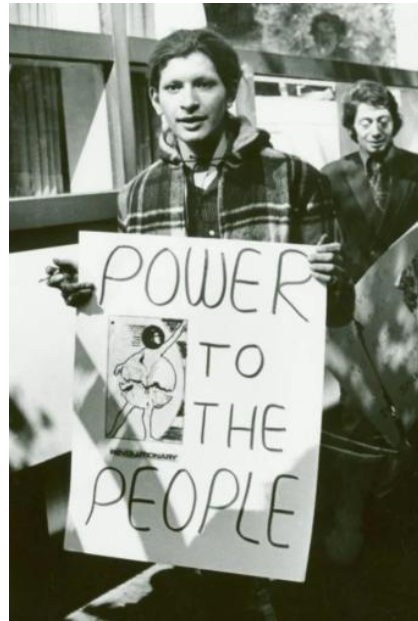


- We live in a capitalist economic system.
- This system works in two ways: rich people have the control over ownership and the means of production, while poor people, the working class, work to live.
- The economic system has often contributed to the exclusion of trans people by limiting access to stable jobs, fair wages, and social protection.
- Many trans individuals face discrimination in hiring processes because of prejudice and rigid gender norms.
- This exclusion can push them into informal or unsafe work, increasing poverty and vulnerability.

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- Economic inequality also reduces access to education, healthcare, and housing, reinforcing social marginalization.
- In capitalist societies, people are often valued mainly for productivity, which can dehumanize those who do not fit traditional expectations.
- Media and institutions influenced by economic interests may ignore or stereotype trans communities instead of supporting inclusion. This can strengthen social discrimination and normalize hate.
- As a result, the economic system does not only create material inequality, but also deepens prejudice and social exclusion.

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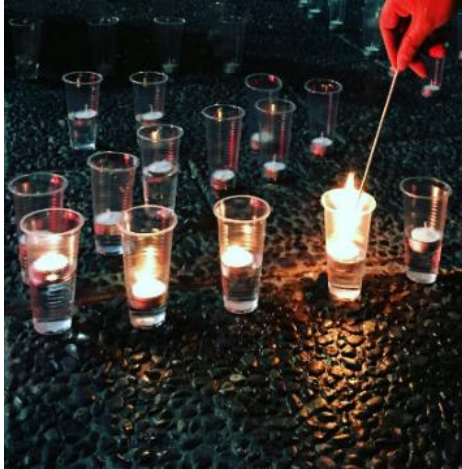

PREVALENCE OF VIOLENCE

- Trans people experience much higher levels of violence than the general population (9-10).
- 47 % of this violence is sexual.
- 54% reported verbal harassment.
- 24% reported physical attack.
- 13% reported sexual assault.

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• HOMICIDE AND LETHAL VIOLENCE

- Global monitoring by Trans Murder Monitoring (TGEU) thousands of trans and gender diverse people have been killed worldwide since records began.
- The highest numbers repeatedly appear in Latin America, especially Brasil, Mexico and Central America.

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• LIFE EXPECTANCY, MENTAL HEALTH AND SUICIDE RISK

- Average life expectancy of trans people around the world is 35 years.
- Then they are survivors and still in risk.
- Trans people, especially trans women of color, immigrants and those in poverty, face higher risks of death due to violence.
- 80% of the Trans womens reported having attempted suicide in their lifetime

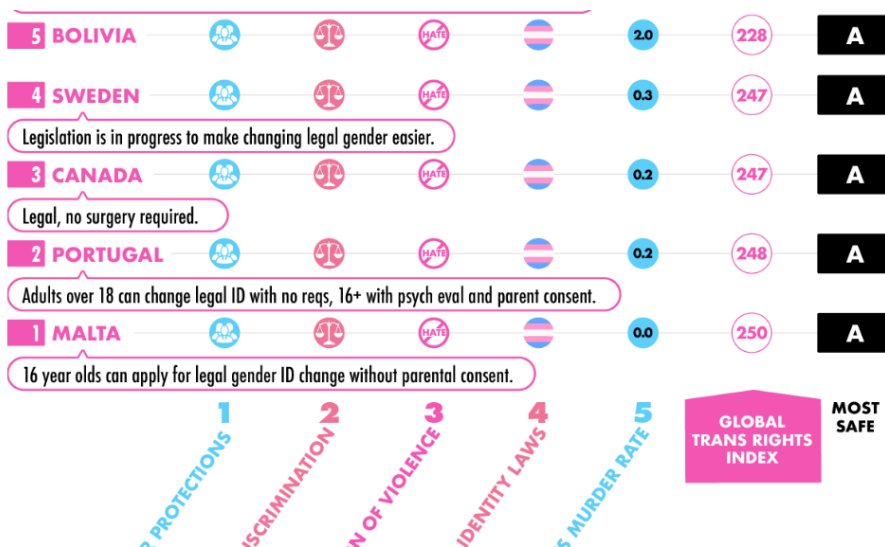
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TRANS RIGHTS AROUND THE WORLD
